How To Get The Bugs Out Of Your Pool

There are many times of bugs that end up in swimming pools. Most of them are recognizable (lady bugs, caterpillars, bees, wasps, etc.) and oftentimes they see your swimming pool as a water source. But there are two types of water bugs that you might see that are a bit more difficult to remove: water boatmen and backswimmers. A water boatman is typically ¼" long and is a grayishbrown bug with a fairly thin body. Water boat-men feed on algae and organic matter. Backswimmers are slightly larger than water boatmen and eat bugs such as water boatmen. Backswimmers swim across the pool surface, and although they are not harmful—they can bite. One way to get rid of water bugs is by eliminating algae and raising the chlorine level in the pool. But the best way to get rid of the water bugs is by using **Bug Off**—which eliminates insects from the pool water. Following is more information on the product:
